Summary:

Main Idea: Paul is sent by ship to Rome under the custody of Julius, but the voyage becomes dangerous due to severe storms. Despite Paul's warning, the crew sails on and is caught in a violent storm that lasts many days. After a shipwreck, all aboard safely reached the island of Malta.

The book ends with Paul proclaiming the kingdom of God freely, emphasizing that the message continues to spread unhindered.
