Understand

1. What main idea or central verse stood out from the message?

3. How does this text point directly to Jesus or God's wider story?

Examine

1. What hidden motives, fears, or doubts does this passage expose in you?
2. Where do you find it hardest to trust God in this area of your life?
3. What comfort or hope does God's character offer you here?

Live

1. What specific habit, thought, or routine needs to change this week?
2. Who can you share this truth with or encourage using what you learned?
3. What is one concrete step of obedience you will take today?
